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
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1004 Disrupted Habituation in the Early Stage of Psychosis

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The cover illustration represents findings from Raschle *et al.* in this issue (pages 984–994). In this work, the authors found that female adolescents with conduct disorder have reduced activation in the left dorsolateral prefrontal cortex compared to typically developing control subjects, in addition to providing further evidence for disrupted functional connectivity in the same prefrontal area.
