The authors regret that there was an error in Table 1 regarding one category of target stimuli.

Our study used a set of items from a prior study (Schmidt, Zimmermann, Banse, & Imhoff, 2015) and replaced the occupational labels in the target categories “others”. This was done to ensure that none of the professions had a possible relationship with OCD. Furthermore, we chose occupational labels that were expected to be

uncommon in patients with OCD living in a large German city, in order to decrease the possibility that participants would associate stimuli from the target category “others” with themselves. Yet, by mistake the old occupational labels were entered in Table 1 of the manuscript. The corrected version of Table 1, including the correct target stimuli for the “others” dimension is printed below. The authors apologize for any inconvenience.
