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On the Cover: This month’s cover image is entitled, I’ll Fly Away. It was created by Heather Lewis, who holds an MFA in Documentary Photography from the Savannah College of Art and Design. Documenting the life and surroundings of her grandparents began around 2002 as an undergraduate photo assignment in large format photography. This image, taken 15 years later, would be her last opportunity to photograph her Papa. As a deeply religious man, Lewis captures him happily surrendering his earthly life as he listens to Alison Krauss sing “I’ll Fly Away.” The moment encompasses his acknowledgement and readiness to move on and therefore is viewed as celebratory. The collection of images, titled Maternal, have been exhibited in North Carolina and was most recently accepted into the National of Academy of Sciences’ permanent online gallery collection.
