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**On the Cover:** This month’s cover image is entitled, HeARTS in Medicine. It was created by Cheryl O’Malley, MD (Internal Medicine Residency Program Director at the University of Arizona College of Medicine-Phoenix) and photographed by Robert Koch, MD (PGY3 resident).
