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Commemorating the 20th Anniversary of Epilepsy & Behavior

This special issue commemorates the 20th anniversary of *Epilepsy & Behavior*. *E&B* has been a key journal and prominent proponent for basic science and clinical research investigating the etiology, assessment, course, and treatment of diverse lifespan cognitive and behavior comorbidities of epilepsy—striving to improve the quality of life of people with epilepsy.

E&B's success has been due to both the dedicated effort of an extremely committed international editorial board working to advancing the care and quality of life of people with epilepsy, and researchers who trust *E&B* as a valued outlet to present their research. Under the continued leadership of founding editor Dr. Steven Schachter and the strong support of Elsevier, *E&B* has enjoyed continued growth reflected in steady annual increase in the number of submissions, publications, and readership reflected in downloads. The voices of the epilepsy community have been reflected in regular editorials from organizations such as the Epilepsy Foundation and the International Bureau for Epilepsy. The Centers for Disease Control provides regular updates of critical epidemiological information through its "Epilepsy by the Numbers" contributions. In commemoration of its 20th anniversary, *E&B* invited representatives from its core constituencies to address topics of their choosing and interest. These core constituencies include basic science, public health, psychiatry, neurology, and neuropsychology. No constraints or expectations were placed on the authors and they were left free to address their interests and concerns. The result is an interesting eclectic slate of contributions reflective of the general content of *E&B* itself.

The *E&B* community sincerely thanks its contributors, reviewers, and readers for their commitment to the journal. We all look forward to the future and contributing to advances in research and care.

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
