The ASPMN Reward and Recognition Committee reminds you to nominate a peer or yourself for one of these prestigious awards! New this year is an electronic submission for the awards via link on ASPMN website and listserv announcement. **The nomination deadline is July 12, 2019.**

Chapter Excellence Award

This award, established in 2000, is presented to an ASPMN chapter in recognition of development and activity for support of pain management nursing. The chapter award is now linked with the submission of the chapter annual reports and will be considered only if this report is active on file.

Dr. Jo Eland Excellence in Pediatric Nursing Award

This award, originally established in 2011 as the ASPMN Nurse Exemplar Award, is presented to a nurse in recognition of outstanding contribution to the field of pain management for the pediatric patient. Self-nominations are encouraged.

Humanitarian Award

This award, established in 2010, is presented to an individual in recognition of outstanding involvement and dedication to the community through voluntary service. Self-nominations are encouraged.

Margo McCaffery Nurse Exemplar Award

This award, established in 2000 and named in honor of Ms. McCaffery in 2018, is presented to a nurse in recognition of outstanding contribution to the field of pain management nursing. Self-nominations are encouraged.

Distinguished Service Award

This award, established in 2000 by the ASPMN Council of Past Presidents, is presented to an ASPMN member in recognition of outstanding leadership, participation, and contributions toward achieving the goals of ASPMN. Self-nominations are encouraged.

Clinical Practice Award

This award is presented to a member who has made outstanding contributions to the field of clinical pain practice. Self-nominations are encouraged.

Advocacy Award

This award, established in 2004 by the ASPMN Board of Directors, is presented to an individual or group in recognition of outstanding contributions in promoting awareness of pain and its treatment through local, state, and national advocacy programs, governmental reform, and/or media exposure. Self-nominations are encouraged.

Nurse Exemplar Award in Pain Management of the Older Adult

This award, established in 2005 by ASPMN and the Nurse Competence in Aging Project of the American Nursing Associate, Specialty Nursing Association Partners Grant, is presented to a nurse in recognition of outstanding contribution to the care of older adults with pain. Self-nominations are encouraged.
