The authors regret that in our published version on page 106, under “2.1. Participants” it currently reads:

“Data was collected from 98 female caregivers of patients with mild to severe dementia. Participants were caregivers of dementia patients in a general hospital and consisted of 50 daughters and 48 daughter-in-laws. We included only those who provided care for the patients at a minimum of three hours a day, and at least three days per week.”

We would like to correct this to:

“Out of a total 132 caregivers who expressed interest to participate,

eight caregivers did not return the surveys, and 25 did not meet our criteria of providing care at a minimum of three hours a day and at least three days per week. One participant was excluded as the residuals in our analysis models exceeded three standard deviations. The final sample included 98 female caregivers of patients with mild to severe dementia. Participants were caregivers of dementia patients in a general hospital and consisted of 50 daughters and 48 daughter-in-laws.”
