Erratum to “Uptake of Community Pharmacist-Delivered MedsCheck Diabetes Medication Review Service in Ontario between 2010 and 2014”

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Please note the following corrections to the article, “Uptake of Community Pharmacist-Delivered MedsCheck Diabetes Medication Review Service in Ontario between 2010 and 2014” published in the June 2017 issue of the *Canadian Journal of Diabetes*.

The title of Table 1 should be, “Number of recipients receiving their first MedsCheck Diabetes (MCD) service by type, fiscal year and age group.” The second column of this table should be “MCD annual or follow up”. Otherwise, the data in the table are correct.

The first paragraph of the Results states that there were 574,603 MCD annual and 13,587 follow ups completed. The correct numbers are 574,350 MCD annual and 121,790 follow ups.

The fourth sentence of the Results section should read “In the same timeframe, 121,790 MCD follow ups were completed, representing only 18.3% of claims for MCD for recipients 66 years of age or older and 16.8% of claims for MCD recipients younger than 66

years of age.” The original number of follow-up claims reported were the number at index.

This, therefore, changes the statement that follow-up assessments were completed in 2.7% to 4.1% of the population, which is found in the second-to-last paragraph of the Discussion on page 257, the conclusion and abstract. This calculation was based on the number of follow ups at index and was misinterpreted. Based on the fact that there were 121,790 follow-up claims and 696,140 MCD claims in total (annual and follow up), the number of follow-up claims remains low, 17.5 % of all claims in the first 3.5 years of the program. Our conclusion that follow up was low and that the majority of people did not receive a follow-up assessment and that ongoing evaluation is needed to ensure the continuity of care is being provided to this population still stands.

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
