Addendum to Abplanalp, S., and Fulford, D. (2019). Physical effort exertion and pain: Links with trait-based risk for psychopathology. *Psychiatry Research*, 271 (2019), 46–51


We write this addendum to inform readers of a calculation error in our manuscript entitled “Physical effort exertion and pain: Links with trait-based risk for psychopathology”, published in *Psychiatry Research* (Volume 271, pp. 46–51). The lead author identified a minor error within the manuscript—one of our measures, the Schizotypal Personality Questionnaire – Brief (SPQ-B), was erroneously scored with one additional item. After correcting the error, our reported statistics (i.e., descriptive statistics of the scale, correlations, and regressions) were slightly changed, but none of the study's findings were impacted. Here we report both the original and updated values:

Descriptive Statistics for SPQ-B

Published: Mean (SD) = 69.26 (22.50); range = 34–122

Corrected: Mean (SD) = 66.53 (22.03); range = 33–118

Correlations between SPQ-B and other measures

Published: Age: $r = 0.08$; Change in pain: $r = 0.31$; average hours of exercise: $r = 0.07$, TTE test: $r = -0.10$

Corrected: Age: $r = 0.08$; Change in pain: $r = 0.30$; average hours of exercise: $r = 0.06$, TTE test: $r = -0.10$

Regression analyses with SPQ-B as predictor of changes in pain

Published: $R^2 = 0.27$; b (SE) = 0.02 (0.01), $t = 2.26$, $p = 0.03$

Corrected: $R^2 = 0.27$; b (SE) = 0.03 (0.01), $t = 2.26$, $p = 0.03$
