**Aims and scope.** *Schizophrenia Research* provides rapid publication of new international research that contributes to the understanding of schizophrenia and related disorders. The journal brings together previously separated biological, clinical and psychological research on this disorder, and stimulates the synthesis of clinical and research data into cohesive hypotheses.

**Types of papers.** (1) Full-length papers: 4000 words. (2) Short communications: 1000–1500 words. (3) Letters to the Editors: 600–800 words, 10 references, 1 figure or table. (4) Special solicited research and/or reviews. (5) Invited comments or hypotheses. (6) Editorials. (7) Schizophrenia meeting reviews: solicited and/or submitted. (8) Book reviews.

**Submission of manuscripts.** Submission to *Schizophrenia Research* proceeds totally online. To access the online submission system please visit <http://ees.elsevier.com/schres>. Manuscripts from the Americas should be submitted via the online submission system to Professor H.A. Nasrallah. Manuscripts from the rest of the world should be submitted to Professor L.E. DeLisi.

Manuscripts are only accepted on the understanding that: (1) they deal with original research and are subject to editorial revision; (2) they have not been and will not be published in whole or in part in any other journal; (3) copyright is transferred from the author to the publisher; (4) the recommendations from the Declaration of Helsinki and the internationally principles for the care and use of experimental animals have been adhered to; (5) any potential or actual conflicts of interest are declared in the submission letter accompanying the manuscript at submission stage.
