Based on the case, the order on “right” and “left” was inverted in “Abstract”, the second paragraph on “Case report” of the page 871, the first paragraph on “Case report” of the page 872, and the Table 1.

It was a clear mistake to describe the case based on anatomical position. As readers would be misunderstood the case as it is, authors would be grateful if readers consider the case based on the figure.
